

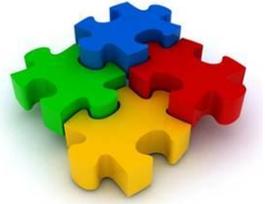

With Test and Trace becoming a fundamental part of the easing of lockdown restrictions, people may be contacted and asked to isolate if they have been in close contact with someone who has, or is showing symptoms of Coronavirus. We all need to be on the lookout for possible scams related to the Test and Trace service.

You can protect yourself and others by saving the Track and Trace number in your phone. **0300 013 5000**

This is the only number that will call you if you are being asked to self-isolate.

Those working for the official Test and Trace scheme will never ask you for any payment information, passwords or PIN numbers, or ask you to buy a product or call a premium rate number.
